AWAKE!

It's hard these days to keep awake. Hard to keep afloat as the tidewaters of tragedy seem to rise all around. Hard to keep balance when the relentless 24-hour media glut brings the farthest trouble to our doorstep and throws it in our faces when we dare to answer the bell. Hard to keep that door ... our eyes ... our minds ... our hearts ... open. Hard to keep faith in times like this.

Yet, it is *precisely* for times like this that people of faith are called: to answer the door to trouble and brave it together. To not only hold up a light in the darkness, but to face the darkness

itself as yet another place hope, compassion and justice may be revealed. Though spiritual seekers may quest toward enlightenment, it is often in the dark places the truth speaks.

The Buddha meditated in the caves of India. Muhammad received the Koran in a cave near Mecca. St. Francis prayed in Assisi's grottos.

In her memoir, *Learning to Walk in the Dark*, Barbara Brown Taylor, one of America's leading theologians, notes, "I have learned things in the dark that I could never have learned in the light, things that have saved my life over and over again If you are in the dark, it does not mean that you have failed," only that there is more to learn.

So goes the life of the spirit, by whatever means we may understand it.

So goes the life of a congregation, a community of light bearers and dark darers that moves forward whatever the odds and upward despite them, covenanted to walk together come what may, to link one arm together and reach out with the other that the surrounding world may know there is yet a place where hope abides and love calls all who would come inside.

This new congregational year, we set about to write the next chapter in River of Grass' story of faith and fortitude. As we lift the pen of tremendous possibility to the page before us, let us determine to make River of Grass a haven in troubled times. Not a place to hide from trouble, but a place rooted so deeply in love, in hope, in joy that trouble cannot help but give way to transformation. Let us dare to keep that door, and ourselves, open. Let us keep faith with those who came before us that we, too, might bear the flame of truth, and with those who will come after to carry on. It is no accident our Unitarian Universalist symbol is the flaming chalice.

Most of all, let us persevere as people who vow to stay awake, no matter how hard it is.

It was the realization that I have stepped into my last year as your Board President, and as I looked around at the faces of the amazing and dedicated Board of Trustees that surrounded me, I felt both a sense of urgency and a sense of calm come over me for I believe with all my heart that we are on the right path and that the time has arrived for us to do amazing things.



I believe that this congregation is on the verge of a wonderful transformation. Amy to spend time together allowing congregants the opportunity to get their questions and concerns addressed before the congregation votes to call Rev. Amy into full time settled ministry at River of Grass.

Sunday, December 7: Congregational Meeting

This meeting will include the congregational vote to call the Reverend Amy Carol Webb as our settled minister.

Sunday, February 1: Mid-year meeting

Sunday, May 3: Annual Meeting

I hope everyone has enjoyed their summer! While you were away, there have been some changes on the Hospitality Scene:



Tatiana Aceros has resigned her staff position with River of Grass Hospitality/Faith Development and is taking a well-deserved vacation before assuming an active membership role within River of Grass.

Many Thanks to **Rick** and **Zena**, **Mike** and **Emilie**, and **Sheryl Silverman** (and others; you know who you are) for helping out and pitching in as needed with preparing and serving and setup and cleanup. Your help has been invaluable and very much appreciated!

However, going forward, the calendar is pretty thin. I have coverage for the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Sundays each month and I would love to have a few more volunteers to cover the 2nd and 4th weeks on a monthly or quarterly basis.

The biggest part of the job is to “smile and wave” during hospitality time, and to deposit (in our drop box within River of Grass) the donations after everything is done.

Volunteers arrive a bit early and make sure we have fresh 2% milk and Half and Half and, of course, Oreo cookies, treats, and juice for the children (all this is reimbursable). Then volunteers help set up the tables, ready the pitchers and carafes, and put together the platters of cookies and treats. There is also a bit of light maintenance after hospitality (sweep, vacuum, damp mop, and empty trash cans; recycle contents of bins into dumpsters; and launder tablecloths and towels between uses as needed).

BUT – we do offer free training and could really use your help! Maybe this is one way that you could get involved AND get to know everyone in our community. Volunteering with the Hospitality team can offer you that!
